#### USDA Natural Resource Conservation Service



- Programs (EQIP) and Conservation Stewardship Program (CSP) provides funding for structural and management conservation practices on agricultural land.
- Regional Conservation Partnership
  Program (RCPP) promotes coordination
  between the NRCS and its partners to
  deliver conservation assistance to
  producers and landowners.
- Technical Assistance Program
  provides landowners with sciencebased conservation planning and
  technical expertise (e.g., engineering
  and biological) unique to the region and
  land use type.
- Watershed and Flood Prevention
  Operations and Watershed
  Rehabilitation Program can assist local
  sponsors to carry out activities for soil
  conservation; flood prevention;
  conservation, development, utilization,
  and disposal of water; watershed
  surveys; and dam rehabilitation.



## Arizona State Forestry



- wildland Fire Hazardous Fuel Grant to reduce hazardous fuels to protect Arizona communities.
- community Challenge Grant
  encourages and promotes citizen
  involvement in supporting long-term
  and sustainable urban and community
  forestry programs at the local level.
- Invasive Plants Grant helps manage invasive noxious plants that threaten forested, woodland, or rangeland areas in Arizona.

- Western Bark Beetle Initiative to integrate pest management to mitigate future tree mortality caused by bark beetles.
- **⊗** Biomass Enterprise Grant to use wood energy.
- ✓ Volunteer Fire Assistance Grant,
  which helps with fire management and
  prevention activities such as training,
  equipping, and organizing rural fire
  departments.



### Arizona Game and Fish



Wildlife Conservation Fund (WCF)
Grant Program. The WCF Grant
Program supports projects that help
conserve, enhance, and restore
Arizona's diverse wildlife resources
and habitats for present and future
generations.

Heritage Fund Program is available for non-profit organizations. Heritage funding goes toward conservation efforts such as protecting endangered species, educating students and the general public about wildlife and the outdoors, and creating new opportunities for outdoor recreation

Arizona Water Protection Fund

(AWPF) provides grants to private,
local, state, federal, and Indian agencies
for the protection and restoration of
rivers and streams.

#### National Fish and Wildlife Foundation



National Fish and Wildlife Foundation provides funding on a competitive basis to projects that sustain, restore, and enhance our nation's fish, wildlife, and plants and their habitats.





### US Fish and Wildlife Service



- Partners for Fish and Wildlife Program provides restoration assistance and funding to landowners to restore habitat for trust species such as migratory birds, anadromous fish, and declining animals and plants.
- Landowner Incentive Program, funded by the US Fish & Wildlife Service and administered through the Arizona Game & Fish Department, provides funding of up to 75% of the costs for private landowners to protect, enhance, or restore habitats that benefit at-risk species.



#### Other Programs and Grants Are Available



- Many other state, tribal, and federal programs and grants are available to help provide cooperators with technical and financial assistance.
- Districts are authorized to enter into agreements with federal, state, tribal, county, and municipal governments to help implement their conservation programs
